Module X – The Kingdom of God

Lesson 2 – The Kingdom in the Torah

- I. Exodus 6:1-8 God repeats the Abrahamic covenant promise concerning the Land
 - A. God told Moses that He will bring the nation of Israel into the land that He promised to Abraham
 - 1. The Land promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and their 'Seed' was unconditional
 - 2. The Land promise to the nation of Israel was conditional (keeping the Law)
 - 3. Both promises involve their enemies being in subjection to them
 - 4. God promised to send His 'Messenger' before Israel to bring them to the Land (Ex. 23:20-22)
 - 5. Israel initially offered the role of being Kingdom 'priests' (Ex. 19:1-6)
 - 6. Since Israel failed, Christians will take on this role (1 Pet. 2:4-5,9; Rev. 20:6)
- II. Balaam's prophecy of the "Seed" and the Kingdom (Num. 22-24)
 - A. Balaam offered money to curse Israel for the Moabites (descendants of Lot)
 - B. God forbids Balaam to curse Israel because they are blessed by God
 - C. Balaam is offered more money, and attempts to inquire from God again
 - 1. Balaam condemned in the NT for his greed (2 Peter 2:15; Jude 1:11; Rev. 2:14)
 - D. The talking-donkey incident
 - E. Balaam prophesied with words from the Abrahamic Covenant (Num. 23:5-11; Gen. 13:16-17)
 - F. Balaam prophesied again, concerning Israel ruling their enemies (Num. 23:18-24; Gen. 49)
 - G. Balaam prophesied a third time: (Num. 24:1-7)
 - 1. Verse 7 LXX, "A man shall come forth out of his seed, and he shall rule over many nations, and his kingdom shall be exalted beyond Agag, and his reign shall flourish."
 - 2. The "Lion of Judah" (from Gen. 49:8-12) described in vss. 8-9.
 - 3. The "Star" of Jacob and the "Scepter" of Israel is in the distant future (vss. 15-19)
 - 1. Destruction of Edom & Moab by the 'Seed' will be at Christ's return: Ob.1:8-9; Isaiah 25:8-12; Isaiah 63:15-21
- III. The Song of Moses (Deut. 32)
 - A. God takes control of the Kingdom after Israel's failure (vss. 39-43)
 - B. The last verse reads differently in the LXX: "Rejoice, ye heavens, with him, and <u>let all the angels of God worship him</u>; rejoice ye Gentiles, with his people, and let all the sons of God strengthen themselves in him; for he will avenge the blood of his sons, and he will render vengeance, and recompense justice to his enemies, and will reward them that hate him; and <u>the Lord shall purge the land of his people.</u>"
 - 1. Paul quoted from the LXX and applied this prophecy to Christ "let all the angels of God worship Him" (Heb. 1:6), a statement that is not in the modern Hebrew text.
